

However, this special issue of ARTis ON, published in collaboration with the **ICOMOS International Scientific Committee on Shared Built** Heritage, does not focus on these topics, important though they are. Instead, it addresses the safeguarding of heritage during the colonial period, examining the processes, ideologies, people, and institutions involved in preserving cultural heritage in colonies

under European rule.
