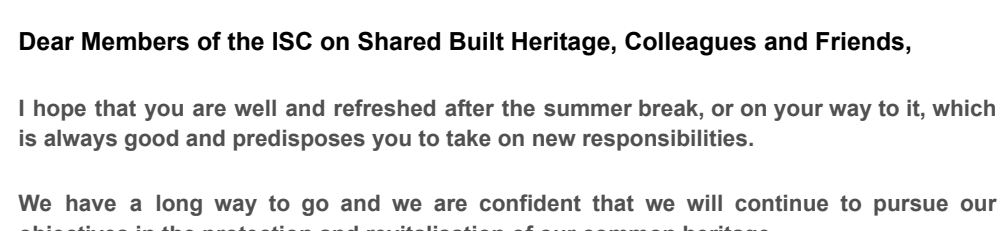

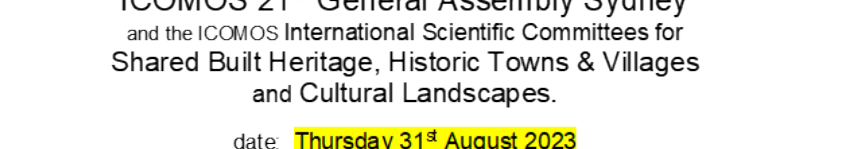

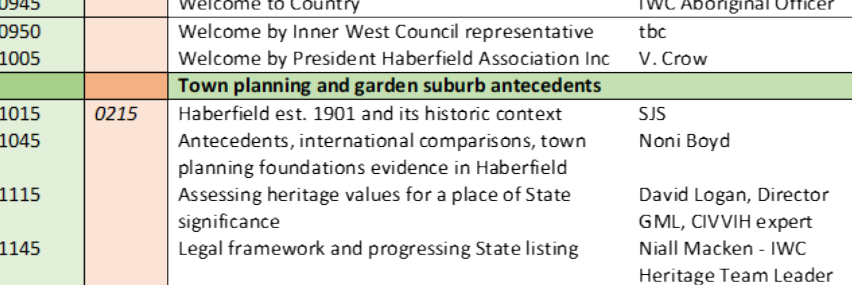
WG 01 - ISCSBH WEBINAR - TOWARDS SYDNEY 2023

On the occasion of this 2023 elective GA in Sydney, the ISCSBH is holding its (almost) customary webinar. Over the past three years, the SBH committee has organized three focused webinars on the common heritage of the country where the international Icomos GA is held. These webinars, born during the first years of the Covid-19 pandemic, also aim to encourage collaboration on common projects, particularly as our geographical dispersal hampers our opportunities for physical interaction.

This year's webinar, held on June 17th, focused - of course - on Australia, with the opening speeches by Maria José de Freitas and Romeo Carabelli introducing the audience to shared heritage and Australia, and to the invited, Susan Jackson Stepowski and Kerime Danis, who spoke about some of the fundamental aspects of heritage in Australia. This webinar will be followed by a workshop to be held in Sydney on August 31st (a Zoom connection should be possible, but more information will be provided in due course).

The presentation will be followed by various reflections from a global perspective and finally a guided walk around the site will provide the necessary background to the theme.

The very promising event with a field of analysis and reflection extended to all participants - our members who participate in this ICOMOS GA 21st are already invited - will be recorded for later dissemination.

At the end a BBQ dinner will be held in a residence in Haberfield as a sign of the warm welcome this important heritage meeting has.

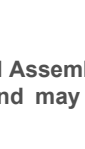

ISCSBH – ELECTIONS TRIENNIUM 2024 - 2026

1- Triennium 2024-2026

In preparation for the upcoming 2024-2026 triennium elections, the membership list was updated, and we are pleased to note there are now 77 expert members, associated and emerging professionals, representing 26 countries, which gives an idea of the current ISCSBH's heterogeneity and cultural openness.

Following the practice of the previous Bureau, we have considered to be voting members those who (1) are the only member of their National Committee (NC) in the ISCSBH; and (2) the member whose NC failed to respond to our request for confirmation but were previously appointed to be voting members in the last triennium.

A) 16 National Committees responded by nominating their voting members. These are Australia, Belgium, Canada, China, Finland, France, Germany, Philippines, Malaysia, Morocco, Netherlands, Portugal, Switzerland, Thailand, Turkey, USA.

B) There are 2 countries – Nigeria and Poland – with only one representative, who was therefore considered to be the voting member.

C) We did not receive confirmation from 2 countries – Spain and Russia -- and for this purpose we consider the voting member appointed for the last election to remain the same.

D) Indonesia has not designated its voting member and has not done so in the past.

E) We have requested an updated ISCSBH Application Form from 2 designated voting members whose information was incomplete, namely from Saudi Arabia and Russia.

F) We have 2 countries with Emerging Professionals and without ICOMOS National Committee. We will continue to count on the active collaboration of these young people to grow our group and their participation will be considered. This is the case of Algeria and Egypt.

After this confirmation, we obtained a total of 24 Voting Members, and we consider the electoral process open for the period of 15 days between 3 and 18 August this year.

2- Electoral Process

The electoral process follows the stipulations of our Bylaws, namely Point 5 and Point 6 (please see the note below).

3- Current Bureau

After 3 years of laying the foundations for their proposed agenda, both Maria José de Freitas and Romeo Carabelli – respectively, current President and Vice President, are hereby expressing their desire to continue in the Bureau for the next triennium 2024-2026. The positions of Vice President and Secretary General remain to be filled and a call for candidates is being open.

Alternatively, any expert voting member who wishes to submit his/her application as a member of the Bureau for the next triennium in the position of President, Vice-President and Secretary General is welcome to submit its candidacy and agenda.

4- Email for candidacy

We therefore request the voting expert members to express their will and announce their candidacy between 3 and 18 August 2023, by emailing the ISCSBH Board at: [sharedbuiltheritage.icomos@gmail.com](mailto:sharedbuiltheritage.icomos@gmail.com)

5- Election

The election will take place at the General Assembly to be held in Sydney on 2 September 2023, in person or by online voting, and may include the participation of an ICLAFI member for supervision.

The new representative for the Emerging Professionals in the triennium 2024-2026 is Mohamed W. Fareed, from Egypt and registered as Independent.

2. VENICE CHARTER [RE]FRAMED 1964-2024

New Heritage Challenges

27-30 May 2024 School of Arts and Humanities - University of Lisbon

The International Charter for the Conservation and Restoration of Monuments and Sites, commonly known as the VENICE CHARTER, was adopted by the ICOMOS International Council of Monuments and Sites following the 2nd International Congress of Architects and Technicians of Historic Monuments held in Venice from 25 to 31 May 1964. This ground-breaking document provided fundamental principles for the conservation and restoration of historic monuments and sites; since then, it has shaped the field of heritage safeguarding, guiding heritage professionals, policymakers, and communities in their efforts to protect and safeguard their cultural heritage. .

In May 2024, we will be commemorating the 60th anniversary of the Venice Charter, a significant milestone in the history of heritage conservation. As we celebrate its anniversary, and in the face of evolving societal, environmental, and cultural dynamics, it becomes increasingly necessary to revisit the principles laid out by the Charter, to reflect on its legacy, examine its relevance in relation to contemporary challenges, and envision a path forward in light of new opportunities.

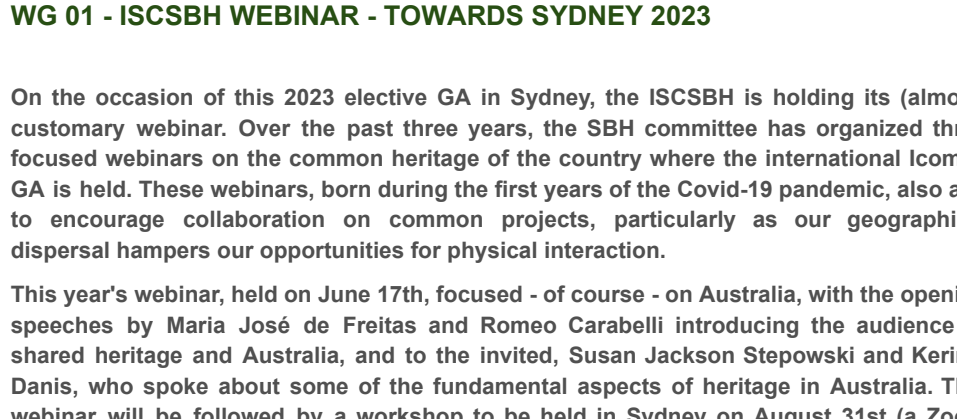
