INTERNATIONAL ICOMOS DAY - 18 April 2024 "Disasters and Conflicts trough the lens of the Venice Charter"

The International Day of Monuments and Sites is celebrated on 18 April, this year under the theme "Disasters and Conflicts through the lens of the Venice Charter", and

it must be said that this is also the year of the commemoration of the 60th anniversary of the existence of this pioneering Charter, to be celebrated in May 2024. Usually known as the Venice Charter the International Charter for the Conservation

and Restoration of Monuments and Sites, was adopted by ICOMOS following the Second International Congress of Architects and Technicians of Historica Monuments, held in Venice from 25 to 31 May 1964, which among others things approved the following text, and I quote: "The conservation and restoration of monuments requires the collaboration of all sciences and techniques that can contribute to the study and safeguarding of monumental heritage"

In fact, the Venice Charter has been an important instrument for the conservation and restoration of monuments, especially in the case of endangered heritage, this attention is all the more demanding because, in addition to the physical component of destruction, we must also consider the spiritual component due to the annihilation, defeat or disappearance of the values in question. In some parts of the world, we are unfortunately in danger of becoming a generation

that lives on the memory of the past, because in the present the heritage has already been destroyed. That's why reconstruction is important, that's why everything must be done to ensure that new technologies can help in restoration, where possible. It is currently crucial to revisit in an interdisciplinary way, the concepts that led to the drafting of the Venice Charter and to see their relevance in the face of current circumstances in which

communities can play a more important role in safeguarding heritage in the light of broader concepts that articulate territorial transformations and heritage values. This is the discussion that is emerging around the world as part of a new framework for the Venice Charter, alongside what is being done in several countries, such as Portugal with the conference entitled "Venice Chart Reframed 1954-2024, New Heritage Challenges" to be held in May, or in Sweden in a conference to be held in June, which makes us think of the SDGs of the World Heritage Convention, namely

Sustainable Development Goals linking cultural and natural heritage, making cities

and human settlements inclusive, safe, resilient and sustainable.

Let's work towards this and join forces to ensure that there is peace, harmony, resilience and a future for heritage in which communities feel integrated in a more holistic vision of heritage and its reinterpretation. This second number of our newsletter is to announce ICOMOS Day and to provide you with more information, including links to some of the conferences taking place around the world or yet to come, because time is short and our participation is necessary. As our work within the ISCSBH for heritage conservation continues, we are also

announcing our next webinar, which will take place on 24 May this year, and I'm attaching some clarifying information so that you can be motivated to take part. I wish you all a happy and rewarding ICOMOS Celebration Day. Yours truly
