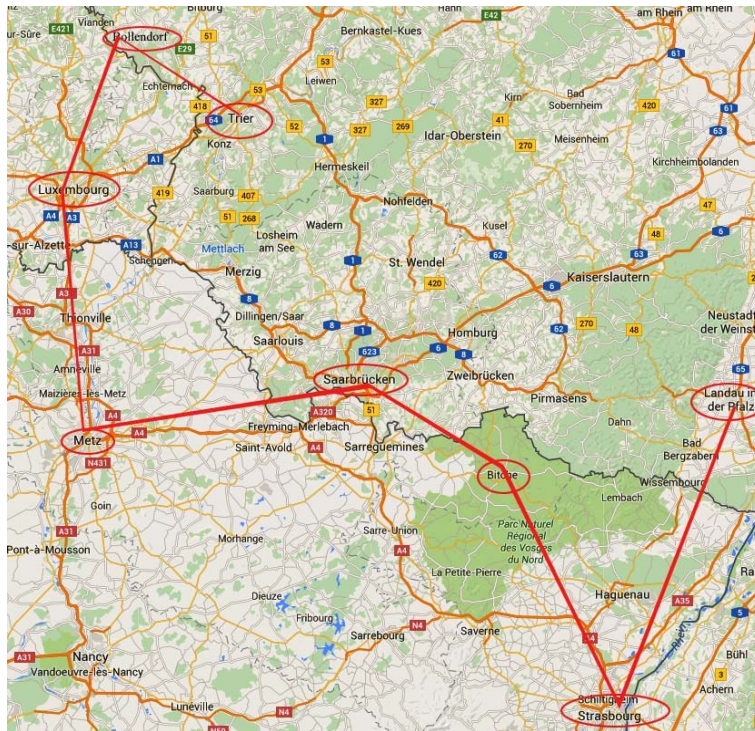

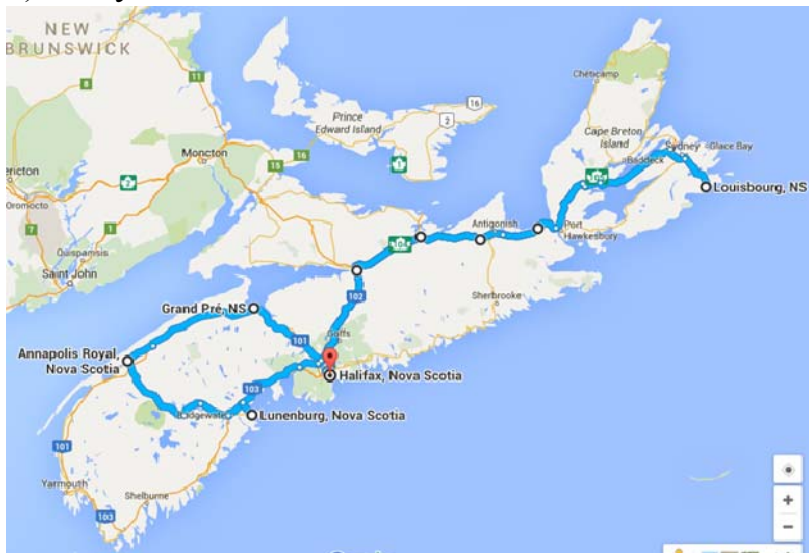

The study tour in this region showed us the significance of the “shared built heritage” in the everyday life of people of the region and how it is treated by people, the conservation and planning policy and the decision makers and stakeholders.

We visited and discussed the issues of various places in

- Trier, (Roman and medieval SBH: Porta Nigra, Museum, Cathedral, Basilica, former Benedictine abbey St. Maximin)
- Bollendorf / Sauer (baroque SBH: Palace and Smeltery Weilerbach),
- Luxemburg City (shared fortification heritage: Remains of fortress Luxemburg, casemate, Tour Vauban),
- Metz (Shared urban heritage 19th C.: Quartier Imperial, Station Metz-Ville, Temple Neuf),
- Felsberg - Berus/Saar, (shared Industrial Heritage : Longwave transmitter Europe 1),
- Saarbrücken (Shared Heritage 20th Century : Former French Embassy),
- Bitche (shared fortification heritage: Fortresses of Vauban)
- Straßburg ((Shared urban heritage 19th C.: Quartier Neuf, Palais du Rhin);
- and some of the group : (Shared built heritage of historic value: Sélestat, - Hohkönigsburg)

b) Study Tour to SBH in Nova Scotia 15.- 25.09.2016

Roundtable 08.- 11.11.2016

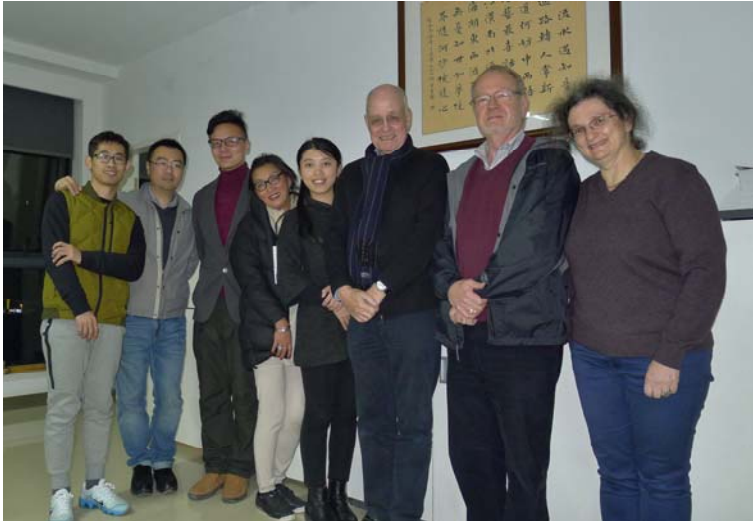
