Inside the ICOMOS family, there are 28 ISC (International Scientific Committee), each bound by its own technical and theoretical mandates, and focused working areas (e.g. Earthen Architecture, Fortification and Military, Polar, Stained Glass, Stone...). The ISC on Shared Built Heritage is particularly guided by an open set of parameters and approaches, as it deals with the triple notion of 'built', 'shared' and 'heritage', implying a strong interest in the question of temporality, interculturality and consideration for elements that align with multiple heritage categories.

The issue of "Shared" is linked not just to the moment of construction, but also to the process of valorisation and meaning making that give form to cultural heritage. Obviously, the definition of "shared" is extremely open and changing. Interrogations arise about the exchanges and cross-influences that have taken place in the past, with a particular focus in the modern era centuries; and about the (co)production of 'genuinely' multi-identity spaces, ecosystems that do not (cannot, do not want to) belong to a single cultural entity.

We will address these issues by taking as a field of observation our own committee on Shared Built Heritage, which has been questioning and reflecting on its identity and mandate for the past decades. The aim of this webinar is to look at the concerns that have embodied SBH since its creation and encourage members to further develop the thinking and operational experience fuelling this ISC.

In this first meeting, we will reflect upon our experiences, with the help of members who lived a part of this ISC's "past". Through personal experiences and memories, and a living depth to the reports of activities that have taken place over the years, the outcome is to identify future paths and research areas we will strive to improve and address.
